In the US, there are 50 states. Each state has its capital city.


2) Listen and try to understand. Discover NYC.

 - Scarlet wants to buy new slim jeans, but the boys doesn't want to go shopping because they hate it/she can go shopping another day.


Listen to <u>the conversation</u> again. Identify their final itinerary. Number on the map the places they visited in order.







